

CALIFORNIA SNAPSHOT: ESTIMATED LOSSES ARE WORSE

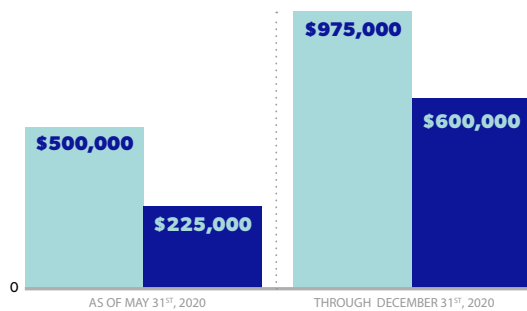
Extracting the data from California organizations, we found that outdoor science and environmental education organizations in the state are facing greater losses and are even less likely to be able to re-open than their national peers.

A total of 228 organizations from California responded to parts or all of the survey. The following results reflect our estimates for the 228 organizations.

By December 31, 2020:

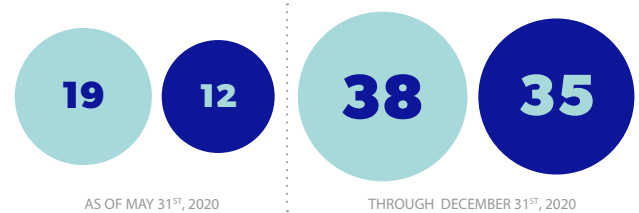
- Over **4 million students** are estimated to miss out on over **9.5 million hours of science and environmental education** in informal and/or outdoor settings
- Organizations face an estimated **\$225 million in lost revenue**, forcing them to furlough, lay-off or reduce over 5,000 staff by the end of 2020
- Only **27% of organizational leaders think it is definite or very likely they will be able to reopen** if social distancing continues through the end of 2020
